Accreditation Process Overview

- Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges/Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACCJC/WASC)
- •Colleges agree to undergo a comprehensive review to verify the degree to which they meet the Commission's Standards.
- ■Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER), which is submitted to ACCJC for use by the peer review team.
- •ISER provides narrative and evaluation, supported by evidence, to affirm the institution meets the accreditation Standards and any plans for improvement.
- •Quality Focus Essay (QFE) that discusses action projects the institution will engage in to improve student learning and achievement.

Accreditation faculty co-chair, Jessica Russell, Executive assistant, Karolina Nazario, Editorial assistant, Marc Bojanowski, and contributions from more than 150 faculty, classified professionals, students and administrators.

Accreditation Process Overview

- ■The ISER is due to ACCJC December 2021.
- •An external peer review team will examine Santa Rosa Junior College's ISER and conduct a site visit and a Special Fiscal Monitoring site visit during that same timeframe.
- ■Team members selected for their expertise from member institutions will write a team report stating the team's findings related to the college's compliance with ACCJC's Standards.
 - Recommendations where SRJC needs to meet the Standards
 - Recommendations for improvement
 - Commendations identifying where the college has exceeded Standards.

Public Notification of Third-Party Comment

- A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation.
- When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so.
- Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website.
- In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit. Institutions will be provided an opportunity to review applicable third-party comments.
